

Minutes of the 32nd IWWWF B Steering committee Meeting

1. Prof. Bin Teng introduced the overall situation for the 32nd IWWWF B, including:
Abstracts received and accepted were 80 and 57, respectively;
Registered participants and accompanying persons were 89 and 4, respectively;
The winner of the Tuck Fellowship: Dong-Min Park of Seoul National University, Korea. The runner-up: Joergen S. Dokken of University of Oslo, Norway;
Sponsor of the Symposium included: Bureau Veritas, K.C. Wong Education Foundation, Dalian University of Technology and SLCOE.
ONR Global has supported previous workshops outside USA and is a potential sponsor for future Workshops.
2. Prof. Y-M Scolan informed about the preparations of the 33rd IWWWF B. The plans include:
Place: L'Orient, outside of Brest, France; Dates: 4-7 April to avoid collision with the Easter holiday; Registration fee approximately 700 EUR; Deadline for abstract: 8th January 2018; Transportation: Fly to Paris CDG, or potentially Amsterdam, or Brest, further connection by high speed train (TGV).
3. Prof. Michael Meylan gave a brief introduction to the preparations for the 34th IWWWF B to be held in Newcastle, Australia.
The venue will be near Newcastle with easy connections.
4. 35th IWWWF B in 2020 is decided to be held in Korea hosted by Prof. Yonghwan Kim. Tentative venue at Seoul or Incheon.
5. There were bids to hold future Workshops from NTNU, Norway, University of Dundee, UK and Shanghai Jiaotong University, China.
6. The procedures of the Tuck Fellowship are running well, including reimbursements of the expenses from the University of Adelaide, where the most recent contact has been by Prof. Jun Zang.
7. Management of the IWWWF B website: Prof. Yonghwan Kim gave a brief overview, including the funding of the website.
8. Prof. Yonghwan Kim and Prof. Harry Bingham were elected as new co-chairs of the International Workshop on Water Waves and Floating Bodies. They replace

Prof. John Grue who as acted as chair of the IWWWFB since 2007.

9. The practice with the Workshop paper policy was briefly mentioned. The present Workshop has been excellent in this respect.
